

## **FROM THE PASTOR ...**

It has been several years since Gary and I had the privilege of visiting the island of Jamaica. During our time there we had the opportunity to travel into the interior of the island to see and experience some of what life is like for most of those who live in this tropical paradise. Aside from the two main cities of Kingston, which is the capital, and Montego Bay, and a few other resort areas, the island is very poor, with the average monthly income being approximately equal to \$25.00 in American currency. In fact, there were times that we actually felt guilty for all that we as Americans have come to take for granted, like comfortable homes and ample food on our tables.

Yet, there was something of which I was a bit envious, and that was the sense of acceptance and unity shared among those who call the island home. Jamaicans have an extremely diverse heritage. The original inhabitants, the Arawak Indians, do not exist today. Sadly, their tribe is extinct, destroyed by European conquerors and disease. The ancestors of today's Jamaicans came from Spain and Africa, from Portugal, China, India, and the British Isles, each bringing with them their own culture and traditions which have become mingled together to give Jamaica the rich and diverse lifestyle and culture that Gary and I experienced. Some examples would be the Spanish names of towns like Ocho Rios and Rio Grande, the rich culture and vitality of those who came from Africa, the spices of Portugal, the British tradition of afternoon tea, and the national food of ackee from Ghana.

The language of the island is another way that the diversity and unity are expressed and experienced. The official language of the island is English, reflective of the many years of British rule. But there is also a native language, "patois" that combines several of the languages of their ancestors. We were privileged to hear this spoken on several occasions, but never could understand what was being said.

It was in hearing "patois" spoken and reflecting upon the Jamaican national motto, "Out of many, one people", that I thought of another time when many languages were spoken at one time....

As we read in the second chapter of the Book of Acts, "when the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting ... All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability." On this day Parthians, Medes, Elamites, Mesopotamians, Judeans, Cappadocians, as well as people from Pontus, Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt, Libya, and Rome, along with Cretans and Arabs gathered together and God poured out the Holy Spirit upon them and the Christian Church was born. Out of many came the one holy catholic church, the Body of Christ.

On May 23<sup>rd</sup> we will celebrate the birthday of the Church as we celebrate the Festival Day of Pentecost. We will also welcome into adult membership of our congregation through the Rite of Affirmation of Baptism, or Confirmation as it is more commonly known, those young people who have successfully completed their years of catechetical instruction. As your Pastor, it is my hope and prayer that we, like those who gathered on the Day of Pentecost and like those who live on the island called Jamaica, may enjoy the rich diversity that is among us and celebrate the unity that is ours as members of our Lord's Body.

-Congregational Council Highlights -

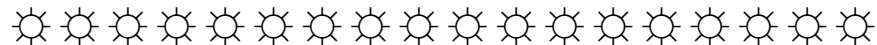
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Highlights from the March 11, 2010 Council Meeting:

- **Treasurer** reported a total of all our assets as of February 28, 2010 of \$314,145.12.
  - **Financial Secretary** reported Income for the month of February of \$19,627.07.
  - **The Finance Committee** noted that our church van is now up for sale with the help of Singh Auto with a list price of \$2,995. Checkbooks have been turned into the Treasurer from all committees. Each committee is being asked to keep track of their own account balances. The council approved allowing the youth to hold \$200 in a petty cash account, to be replenished by the Treasurer when their balance drops below \$100.
  - **Pastor's Report** – council approved the request for transfer for Cheryl (Laky) Weaver to St. John's UCC in Whitehall. The Pastor's Shore Retreat with the youth will not happen this year do to the availability of "The Luther Inn" and Pastor Gary/Betty's schedules. The pastor also expressed her concern as to the lack of class participation by the Confirmation Class students.
  - **Christian Education** – council approved the recommendation by the St. Peter's Pre-School to increase tuition amounts for the 2010-11 school year. The two-day program (3's) will be increased from \$72/month to \$80/month. The three-day program (4's) from \$89/month to \$100/month. And, the Drop-In Center fee will be raised from \$10/day to \$12/day.
  - **Youth Ministry** – the third floor classroom is being painted by the Allen Family and Mike Pfeffer. The youth raised \$300+ during the famine sleep-over.
  - **E-mail Messaging** – it was suggested that we gather as many email address as possible of our members and send emails regarding upcoming events. Addresses would only be requested from adult members over the age of 18.
  - **Member Business Directory** – it was also suggested that we solicit members who have their own businesses and publish a 'Business Directory' for our congregational use.
  - **Kiwanis Breakfast** – the East Allentown chapter of the Kiwanis Club has requested use of our building for an 'All-You-Can-Eat' Breakfast on May 8 from 7:30-11:00 a.m. Council approved the request.
  - **Allentown Census Board** requested use of space to hold training sessions. Request was approved.

Highlights from the April 8, 2010 Council Meeting:

- **Dakota Sarbaugh** was appointed to fill a two-year vacant term on Congregation Council.
- **Treasurer** reported account balances as of March 31, 2010 of \$298,789.62.
- **Financial Secretary** reported income as of March 28, 2010 of \$22,525.69 (\$1,400.40 of this was from automated giving).
- **Property Committee** – our insurance carrier has been contacted to see if any of our recent boiler repair expenses will be covered under our policy. The water loss from our boiler has tapered off. ASL Mechanical will be here within the next several weeks to complete needed repairs.
- **Social Ministry** requested approval to hold their Fall Bazaar on Saturday, October 23 with set-up October 21-22.
- **Worship & Music Committee** – the bells need to be refurbished – the committee will speak to the Treasurer in regards to funding the cost. Concern was also raised as to whose responsibility it is to lock up after special worship services.
- **Youth Ministry Committee** invited council members and their families to 'Volleyball Night' on Sunday, May 7.
- **Lutheran Congregational Services, Inc.** announced a new ministry being shared with Diakon, called 'Catherine's Closet'. In order to make this ministry a success in our area, they have secured warehouse space to hold items to be shared with other non-profits, as needed.
- **Church Van** – an offer was made of \$2,500. After some discussion it was felt that we should make a counter offer of \$2,750.
- **Long Range Planning** – council and committee heads will be invited to attend a workshop, to be led up by LCS, Inc. in the fall, to discuss the future of St. Peter's Lutheran Church. Details will be announced at a later date.
